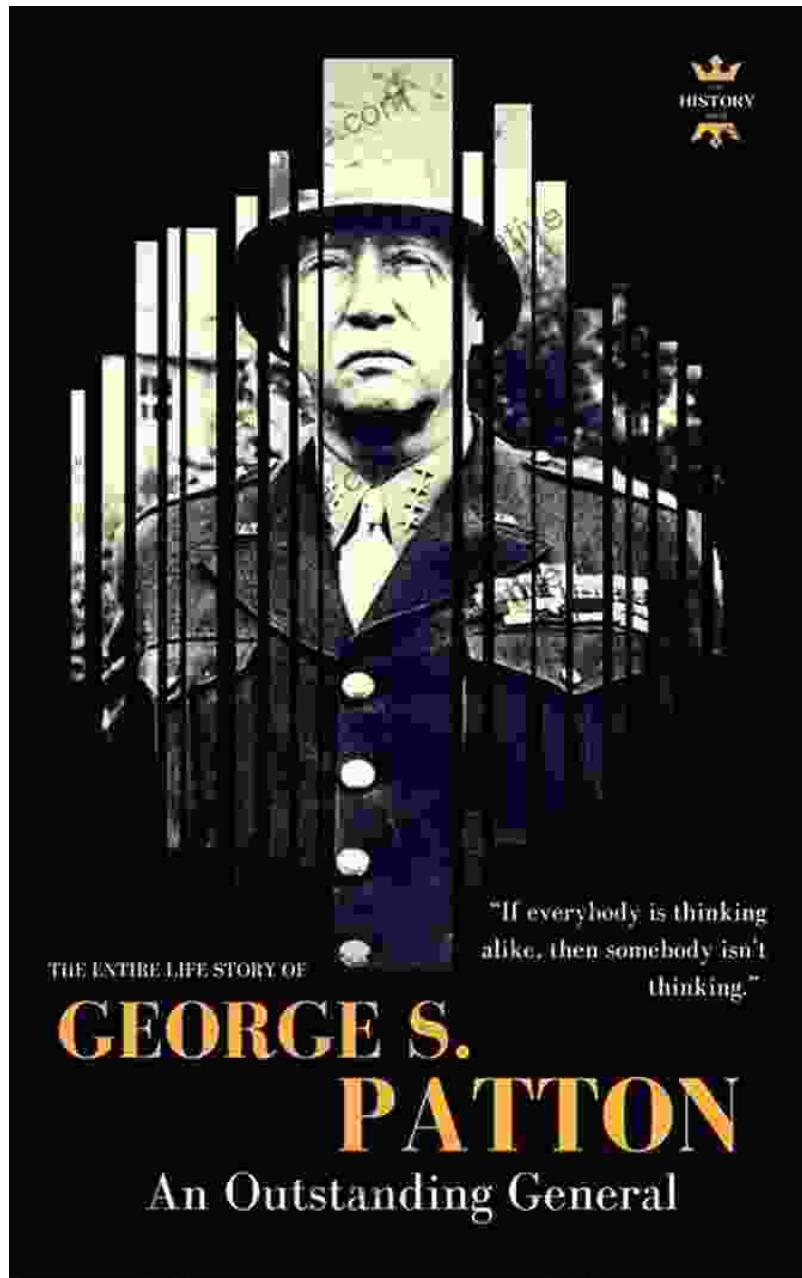


Ulysses S. Grant: An Outstanding General, A Great President

Civil War
